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Key Distribution Guidelines

Asking your locksmith to stamp "Do Not Duplicate" on the key is meaningless if the distribution of blanks is not strictly controlled by the manufacturer. The only way that a manufacturer can hope to control the sale of their key blanks is by receiving a Utility Patent: A Utility Patent applies to the way an invention works, as opposed to a Design Patent, which only applies to the way an invention looks.

How to Develop Effective Key

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Control Policies

This will be achieved by the implementation of a “Key Distribution and Issuance Policy.” II. GENERAL GUIDELINES. It is the policy of Hostos Community College, of The City University of New York, that other than normal working hours, all buildings shall be locked in order to maintain the security of both the buildings and their contents.

Key Policy - Hostos Community College

Each key issued to College employees, contractors, or students shall be documented by the Facilities Lock Shop. No key shall be transferred from one person to another without being returned to the Lock Shop for appropriate re-issue. Each key will be stamped with a unique code and issued by code to a specific individual.

This requires that an implicit trust is established so that this key is not shared with any other outside third party.

Ensure that standard application level code never reads or uses cryptographic keys in any way and use key management libraries.
